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What is the Role of the School Council? It serves as a policy-level advisory bodies to the Principal, Superintendent, and local board of education. The Council may advise and make recommendations on any matter related to school improvement and student achievement. Georgia's A+ Education Reform Act of 2000 required that school councils be established in every public school.

What is the Purpose of School Councils? It brings communities and schools closer together in a spirit of cooperation to solve difficult education problems, improve academic achievement, provide support for teachers and administrators, and bring parents into the school-based decision-making process.

Who Serves on School Councils? The principal, teachers, parents and business persons serve. Required by the Georgia General Assembly, parents are to be the majority members.

Composition of the MMS School Council: The MMS Council Bylaws call for the following membership.

- The Principal
- Two certificated teachers elected by the teachers
- Two parents/guardians of currently enrolled MMS students who are not school employees, elected by the parents
- Two parents who are business persons, selected by the Principal

The school council may increase the number of members as long as parents remain in the majority.

Expectations of School Council Members: Members of the school council are accountable to the constituents they serve and shall:

1. Maintain a school-wide perspective on issues
2. Regularly participate in school council meetings
3. Participate in information and training programs
4. Act as a link between the school council and the community
5. Encourage the participation of parents and others within the school community
6. Work to improve student achievement and performance.
